e. Honorable Delegate, Shawna Ann Claw

Honorable Delegate Shawna Ann Claw: thanks the people for attending meetings. Delegate Claw talked about her projects, waters rights and traveling for meetings. Delegate Claw explained the Budget Finance revenues and how each department get a percentage.
