Community members wanted to know if the Veteran fund amount and if there is deadline and if it could be used to assist veterans. The Veteran Fund is \$5,000 and it can only be used for events and when Veterans get together. The fund cannot be used for fund raising and it does not expire. There were also questions about the Earth and Dam Fund which had received \$1.9 million and now it only has \$1.4 million. It was explained that the Chinle Chapter used some of the funds from the Earth and Dam ARPA Fund due to it being authorized for the flooding and equipment (dump truck) were purchased for the flooding and work on the berm. Other questions were about the Traffic Study and why if it is \$15,000 there is only \$7,500 in the fund. It was explained that there is only \$7,500 because as of recent the ARPA Funds are only being given at 50% of the fund and another increment will be given when work of project is shown. Community member commented that it was the same with the New Warehouse being only given \$600,000 instead of its \$1.2 million ARPA Fund. Some other community members also wanted to know why there is very little funding for Scholarship disbursements and wanted to know if there could be an increase for student, they also recommended that the Scholarship requirements could add a parent to help meet the requirements. They asked for the Plan of Operations be changed for the Scholarship, and the Housing Discretionary Plan of Operations. Delegate Shawna Ann Claw explained that ARPA Funding and that Chinle received 100% of their ARPA Funds of \$8.8 Million already and now the other ARPA funds will be at 50%. Some chapters have not get their funds.

CCG Manger Walton Yazzie: responded that the road could not be bladed because it is too rocky and the housing discretionary request is being denied because she lives on monument land and it is up to NPS.

Chapter President Dr. Rosanna Jumbo-Fitch: explained that there is upcoming meeting Agency review meeting and if Pamela could submit her documents again they could be added to the Roads Review.

Delegate Shawna Ann Claw: Explained that there is no law requiring a Home site lease to get housing discretionary and that there is a process for people living Monumental Lands to gain a Home site lease. Some of the steps are to go before RDC to get a waiver. Some Homesite leases are Grandfathered in.
